Attendance

As we end this half term, please look out for the whole school attendance letter informing families that schools have a statutory duty to ensure children attend school regularly.

During the pandemic the government adapted national attendance procedures to support families coping with the impact of Coronavirus. Although Coronavirus related absence is still taken out of your child's overall attendance figure, the government now expects other procedures and sanctions associated with low attendance to be reinstated.

Therefore, if your child's attendance falls below 95% you will be contacted by the school attendance team and if it falls below 90% (classed as Persistently Absent) your child's attendance will be closely monitored and an action plan drawn up.

The vast majority of our children continue to have excellent attendance and this is reflected in the large numbers of attendance certificates given out at the end of each half term. We also recognise children do get poorly and as a result attendance can suffer. But, by working together, in partnership, we can ensure all our children have every chance to regain their true potential after the difficult time they have endured.


Thank you for your continued support-let's make every school day count.
