Covid Update

Please continue to follow the Covid 19 guidance. If your child is unwell, please perform a lateral flow test. If the LFT is negative and they are well enough to be in school, then they should return. If the LFT is positive then they should have a PCR test and remain at home, at least until the result is known. If negative, the child can end self-isolation; if positive, the child should isolate until at least 10 days after their symptoms appeared. School is continuing to keep high use areas cleaned frequently, regular hand washing and hand sanitiser is used along with keeping classrooms ventilated.
