## What is Subitising?

Subitising is when you are able to look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting. This only works with small groups of numbers, as we only subitise up to 5 things. It was first introduced by a Swiss psychologist called PIAGET.

# Types of Subitising

Perceptual Subitising: This is the ability to recognise the number of objects in front of you without using any mathematical process-it's instinctive.

**Conceptual Subitising:** This is where you are able to recognise a number by grouping it into small sets. For example, if you are shown a line of 6 black dots, it's likely you will automatically group these into 2 groups of 3, and then know there are 6 in total without counting each time.


