Free School Lunches

All infant aged children are eligible for a free school lunch. Our on-site caterers, **ABM**, provide hot and cold lunches for all the children at both the Infant and the Junior schools. There are always **two hot options, jacket potatoes and sandwiches as well as a selection of puddings, including fruit.** The children look forward to choosing their midday meal during morning registration. Then at lunchtime they are all experts at using the **Cyberpad** to check their meal choice.

Food is so expensive at the moment that we would like to remind families who are choosing to provide their own packed lunch that their child can move to school lunches at any point. Just let your classteacher know. After half term we have a **new menu** to choose from. 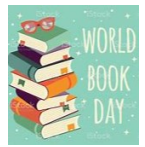
