You may have heard in the news that school attendance has fallen nationally since the Covid 19 pandemic and the government is launching a campaign to raise the focus on absence rates, and improve attendance in all schools. This is for many reasons, some of which are very understandable,

such as heightened awareness about preventing the spread of infectious illnesses and in the case of young

children, the high levels of exposure to common childhood illnesses and germs.

At Rednal Hill we keep families informed every half term of their child's attendance and tell you your child's attendance both as a % of the year to date, and also as the number of days absent. Most of our children have excellent attendance, but this table is a powerful reminder of just how much learning children miss over a school year when they are absent.

95%	=	40 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 8 days in total or 1 week and 3 days
90%	=	80 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 16 days in total or 3 weeks and 1 day
85%	=	120 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 24 days in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
80%	=	160 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 32 days in total or 6 weeks and 2 days



Punctuality is part of attendance. If your child arrives at school late they miss the social side of chatting to their friends and hearing the teacher explain what they will be doing that day. Imagine how we would feel as adults entering a room late. Each day starts with a

fun challenge such as answering an Enquiry question or seeing what children can recall about a previous lesson. Phonics is taught at the beginning of the day because research shows this is when children are
